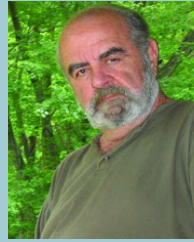

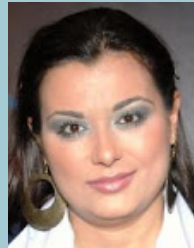
ALECO CHRISTAKIS, PH.D.

Why and How we ought to Re-Invent Democracy: The Science of Structured Dialogic Design

Global and European democracy needs a new approach for citizen participation, which is designed specifically to address highly complex civic problems through the use of the science of dialogue.

The training is for persons interested in learning more about the science of Structured Dialogic Design (SDD) and those who are working toward becoming active SDD Facilitators.

The training will include theoretical foundations, practical applications relevant to discovering the science, role-playing as well as face-to-face and virtual lectures.

Participants will learn:

- ➔ The nature of complexity and the science of dialogic design;
- ➔ The Structured Dialogic Design (SDD) architecture for addressing complex problems with authentic stakeholder participation;
- ➔ Application of the Co-Laboratory of Democracy approach using the Cogniscope II Software;
- ➔ The Domain of Science Model (DOSM) and its relationship to the science of dialogic design;
- ➔ Systemic thinking & its relationship with the Global Problematique
- ➔ Applying the Co-Laboratory of Democracy approach to real problems in your context
